## **President's Message**

We are preparing for our upcoming reconstruction project which will take place in 2011 and 2012. This will include replacing old sidewalks, street lights, sewer pipes and resurfacing roads. There will be residents going door to door to see how many of our residents are interested in getting decorative lighting. The cost of the standard street light is covered by the City. The difference in cost between the standard street light and the decorative lighting would be added to our tax bill. The door to door campaign will give more details as to the additional cost. I wanted to encourage our residents to seriously consider the decorative lighting choice in order to beautify our community that much more. Perhaps these light fixtures, flower pots along our streets, new sidewalks, and a reduced flow of traffic through our community, will increase our property values, a benefit to every Woodcroft resident. Please keep in mind that a community that looks run down encourages vandalism, graffiti, and other such crimes. The city for example encourages property owners to quickly paint over walls painted with graffiti in order to discourage further vandalism—it is called the broken window effect. Broken windows engender more broken windows. So if we as a community show care, we build on a trend encouraging pride in ownership. A community that looks well taken care of will encourage positive activity within our community. Please consider all this when you make your decision on what type of lighting you would prefer in our community. An example of the standard street light can be found in our neighbouring community to the east in Sherbrooke. I personally envision Woodcroft as having the same kind of quiet streets with a quiet central core that a community like Old Glenora has with its beautiful fountain. The quiet streets of Old Glenora have encouraged high property values and a sense of pride of ownership. Woodcroft too can build on our own sense of pride as we work toward positive change in developing our new Community League playground in the Spring of 2011; by the wonderful renovations occurring at the Brentwood Homes; having decorative street lights, new sidewalks, and newly resurfaced roads by 2012; by considering some well placed elegant park benches and flower pots along select streets throughout the community; by considering fountains or statues roundabouts in well placed intersections throughout our community and/or in the pocket park across from St. Mark's school. If we can convince the city to help us with calming some of the thousands of vehicles that choose to short cut through our community, we too can have a safe, quiet community for all residents to enjoy. Not only will our property values increase by these efforts but we will reduce the probability of crimes being committed in this well kept and pride-filled place we call home. Beautiful streetscapes will encourage more people to get out of doors to walk, cycle, run or stroll and get to know more neighbours, building on our "social capital". This is the vision that I and many Woodcroft residents have for our community – I hope you will join us in the years to come in realizing this vision!

Sportball teaches balance, strength, coordination, timing and endurance in a supervised, non-competitive environment. The program reinforces the benefits of teamwork and skills development rather than the importance of winning -- giving children the confidence and social skills necessary to succeed in sport and life.
