## Surveys, Surveys, Surveys

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we would like to thank all of the community members who completed our surveys this year. We did have two surveys go through our community, one for the community as a whole with some focus on the playground and the second on the traffic issues that Woodcroft faces. As a Board of Directors we are trying to address the issues that are important to our community members. We only know what is important to our community by receiving your feedback. Again, thank you to all of you who completed the surveys. Over the next couple of years, our focus will be on what the members of Woodcroft Community has told us are the issues for them.

### City of Edmonton Animal Control Bylaws Require the Following:

- All City parks require owners to walk their dogs ON LEASH.
- Some parks are off limits to dogs.
- Dogs are prohibited at all times from school grounds, sport fields, playgrounds and golf courses.
- Excessive waste is offensive, smelly and may be a health issue.
- Pick up after your dog on public and private property.
- Carry a plastic bag - pick up and deposit poop in the garbage.
- Fine for "not picking up" and "excessive defecation on private property" is \$100.

**Please note:**  
No dogs are allowed off leash at the Woodcroft Hall playground or the Woodcroft Elementary School sport fields.  
Please use the off leash area on 142 St. and 115 Ave.

### **Woodcroft Traffic Concerns Committee Report September, 2008**

This summer the Traffic Concerns Committee distributed Quality of Life surveys to determine what were the concerns of greatest interest to Woodcroft residents. We were able to receive a grant of \$4,000 from the Alberta Traffic Safety Fund to conduct a survey to determine if traffic speeds and volume were of great concern for our residents or were there other issues such as crime, the Woodcroft school closure that were more pressing for residents. We hired Bannister Research Inc. to prepare the survey instrument and tally the scores. Our Traffic Committee distributed the surveys by bulk mail, through our Community League internet site and door to door.

The collection and compilation of the survey data is complete. Bannister Research has finished their first draft of the report. The Traffic Concerns Committee has reviewed the first draft and has asked Bannister Research to clarify some details and to run some additional queries in the database. We anticipate that the project will be completed within the next month. The final report will be presented at the AGM on October 18 and posted on the Woodcroft Community League website.
