#### Message from the President, Patricia Grell

We have received good news from the City of Edmonton Transportation Department as they **address the many traffic issues** brought up at the May 15<sup>th</sup> traffic concerns meeting. Although the details are sketchy, George Teply, P.Eng has confirmed that the City will be providing our community with speed display signs, better cross walk signs, and better pavement markings at the cross walks. More details of all the actions the Transportation Dept. is willing to take on our behalf will be disclosed in the weeks to come.

Despite the progress achieved regarding **transportation issues**, there are more issues to be tackled. Please join us to review our community transportation priorities on **Thursday**, **March 22**, **2007**, **7:00 pm at the hall**.

Kim Cordeiro, a long time soccer coach and volunteer has agreed to coordinate our **outdoor soccer program** for the 2007 Spring season. Thank you Kim for contributing to our community!

I have had feedback from St. Mark's School and Woodcroft Elementary School stating their support for **cross country ski trails in Coronation Park** if there is a supply of skis that they can use for the students at their respective schools. The plan for the trails is in the works but may not actually materialize until fall 2007.

On February 6 I attended a **meeting for Presidents and Treasurers** hosted by Russ Dahms of the **Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues** on the workings of a community league. It was very informative and gave me a chance to see what was happening in other community leagues in the City. Many Community Leagues, for example, hire a bookkeeper to look after the day to day business of paying bills, creating financial statements for the executive, reconciling bank statements etc. The Treasurer's role then becomes one of overseer of the budget to ensure the money is available to fulfill the community's vision. Carl Dunger of our community has come forward as a volunteer to assist our Treasurer in carrying out the duties of a bookkeeper. Thank you Carl!

On February 21 with the assistance of Una Bryce and Jane Molstad, the executive along with a number of interested residents engaged in a **visioning process to determine what our top 3 priorities** for the community were for 2007. These 3 priorities were:

- 1. Improve the financial situation of the league
- 2. Address traffic concerns
- 3. Create opportunities for recreation within our community for all age groups; have a plan in place to begin building our new playground

**Other priorities** that were identified but were seen as not as urgent were: increasing the number of people participating in the community and developing processes that could be passed along to new members of the executive thus making the transition simpler and requiring less effort for those accepting these positions.


