Message from the President, Patricia Grell

I received a call recently from a concerned resident about my discussion of the numerous buses passing through our community. No one is trying to take away a community bus route here in Woodcroft. Woodcroft used to have a community bus route until about 10 years ago, when a review was made of ETS and a new plan put in place. The plan was called "Horizon 2000". This plan called for high frequency bus service on arterials (arterials are the 4 lane roads that allow vehicles to travel at least 60 km/hr). Smaller community routes would then feed into these higher frequency bus routes. Although Horizon 2000 was created with input from communities and was approved of by our City Councillors, it was not implemented—Charlie Stolte, Manager of ETS told me this himself. Instead of using Horizon 2000, the management of ETS decided to add more and more buses to new cross- town routes to service the City at large. This led to the current system that we have now in Woodcroft with buses passing through our community at a rate of over 100 buses per day. During peak hours this means that 1 bus every 4 minutes is passing by our local elementary school and playgrounds as children go to and from school. David Kun, the Principal of Woodcroft Elementary School told me recently that parents are concerned about the buses bumping the center marking guard ("Cleo") used at the school crosswalk. The Cleo is the size of a child and is used by the children on cross walk duty. When it falls down, the children must run into the street to set it upright again. He also reported that parents are concerned about the speed of the buses as they pass by the school. The residents who live along the bus routes on 139 St. and 115 Ave. are dealing not only with safety issues but quality of life issues - the buses begin running at 5:45 am and continue on until 11:05 pm at night. This was not always the case -- the buses used to stop at 6:00 pm. Because our community collector roads were not built to handle fully loaded buses, residents experience their homes vibrate and their windows rattle as the buses pass by. Other residents have had to move their bedrooms to their basements or the back of their houses in order to get a good night's rest.

Woodcroft residents were not consulted when ETS chose to disregard Horizon 2000 and implement their own plan. Woodcroft needs to get a community bus route which would serve not only residents on the West side of the community but the East side as well. If ETS would implement a grid system of bus service as was outlined in Horizon 2000, then there would be high frequency bus service available on all sides of our community: 118 Ave. to the North, Groat Road to the East, 142 St. to the West and the Westmount Transfer Station to the South. With high frequency bus service on our arterials as well as a community route to service all of Woodcroft, we will be well served by ETS. Come to the meeting with ENTRA on Tuesday, May 15, 7:00 pm at the hall to offer your input into the kind of transit service you wish for Woodcroft.

Brice Stephenson, the Manager of Transportation Planning has denied our community's request for temporary traffic calming measures on our busier streets and avenues. They will however, assist us with this project if we survey our residents and find that 60% are in favour of something being done to reduce the speed and volume of traffic cutting through our community. More details of this survey will be forthcoming. Another possibility is that we could get funds for temporary sidewalk extensions from the Alberta Traffic Safety Fund. Our Traffic Concerns Committee will be submitting a request for funding for at least 3 intersections within the community. If you wish to offer your input on this subject, come to our next Traffic Concerns Meeting, Thursday, May 17, 7:00 pm at the hall. If you want something done about the traffic in our community it is important to let our City Councillors know your concerns. Call them or email them today! Their contact information is on the front cover of the newsletter.

The Woodcroft Community League Executive has cancelled the free Grant MacEwan swim which was included as a perk if you purchased a Woodcroft Community League membership. We have had to cancel it because of lack of interest. It costs the community \$1,000 per year for this service but only 100 visits/year were made under this program. I am researching other possibilities for a community swim elsewhere in the City.



Report from Recreation Meeting May 1, 2007

Proposed Changes to Recreation Facilities in Coronation Park

The City of Edmonton is proposing a number of changes to Coronation Park which will include a new recreation facility currently reserved for the tennis courts and additional parking on the land now reserved the Ross Sheppard playing fields adjacent to the Westmount Transfer Station. Additional parking will be placed North and East of the existing Peter Hemingway Fitness and Leisure Centre. The new recreation facility will include a gymnasium; a fitness centre; multi-purpose areas including child minding spaces, party room, concession, commercial retail and services; twin arenas with a walking/jogging track above the arenas.

If these developments go through, a road will be built so that users of these facilities can access them off of 111 Ave. Drivers will continue to be able to access these facilities through our community and down the park road.

The City of Edmonton is eventually looking at developing a district water park immediately across from the community league parking lot and a cricket pitch to the West of the community hall. The lawn bowling club would like to build a year round facility on the current bowling greens. There are also plans for the Telus World of Science to expand their facility in the near future. A meeting with Telus World of Science and our community will be announced in the next 4-6 weeks.

Some residents have expressed concerns over the gradual loss of our green spaces and the increasing amount of traffic that these new developments will create through our community.
