## President's Message

We have had a very eventful Fall season here in the Woodcroft Community. **Our Fall BBQ was very well attended** with many new families coming out to meet one another and find out what is going on in our vibrant community. Some of us over in my neck of the woods (139 St. and 116 Ave.) had a Block Party which featured a scavenger hunt, a sing a long and of course wonderful home cooking from our neighbours. Our **Mom's group** has been so well attended that the moms are now meeting **every Wednesday morning** instead of just once a month. Some of the moms have donated toys to the group so now we have a nice bunch of toys for our little ones to use. Other care givers of children such as grandparents and dads are very welcome to join our group!

**Sportball** which is a non competitive introduction to a variety of sports for ages 2 – 8, made a good start in Woodcroft this Fall. We had 6 kids sign up and so we are going to run it again Saturdays from **January 16 – March 20**. There will be a free demonstration of Sportball from 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm on Sat. Dec. 5 at our hall if you would like to learn more about it.

A couple of weeks ago our traffic committee was out monitoring traffic using the *Speed Watch Program*. This Program uses a speed display sign to let drivers know the speed they are going. One of our community constables lent us a hand during the Program and gave out tickets to those travelling 10 km/hr over the limit. In a one hour period, he wrote 3 tickets and gave many warnings. He told drivers that our community was not tolerating speeders any more and said that most drivers showed remorse at driving so quickly. On another occasion he gave out 11 tickets in 25 minutes to drivers rolling through the stop sign at 139 St. and 115 Ave. I couldn't get over how many people stopped by or waved at us to thank us for helping reduce speeding in our community. It is great to get your support!

Residents of our community may be smelling some **strong odours** coming through their homes as the Michel's trucks work on our sewer system. They are inserting new piping down our alleys to replace the sewer pipes that have collapsed over their 50 years of use. The system they are using creates a very strong odour from the resin they are using to create the piping underground. To get rid of the strong odour, open your windows and pour water down your drains. Talking to one of the workers in my alley, he suggested that if the sewer pipes have collapsed under our back alleys, it is likely that they have collapsed from our homes to the back alley pipe. **If you are interested to know the condition of the sewer pipe leading from your home to the city line, phone Todd Yudza, Drainage Services at the city at 496-2876 to get a free inspection.**

On October 6, 2009 our **city councillors voted to conduct a pilot project of 3 – 5 communities** to look at **reducing the residential speed limit** within the City of Edmonton. The Transportation Dept. will work with the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues to design the pilot project and will report back to Council in March 2010. Stay tuned!

We had our **Annual General Meeting** in October and have seen some long time volunteers step down while new ones came forward. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Zenon Martynkiw who headed up our Neighbourhood Watch Committee, Stefan Martynkiw and Stephen Just our Web Masters and Nina Pronchuk our Membership Coordinator for their many hours of dedicated service to our community. Our new volunteers are: Dan Ethier as Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator, Mark Tofsrud, Membership Coordinator, Ben Molnar, Vice President, Erin Dawson, Moms Group Coordinator, Deb Lee, Snow Busters program for seniors, and Linda Thiessen, Web Administrator. Thank you so much all of you for sharing your time and talents with our community!

In other news, the **Brentwood Homes** management told me recently that the **3 story walk up will be built in 2010 as planned**. There have been some construction delays due to complying with various city building requirements. The 3 story walk up will provide 29 single parent families with very much needed affordable housing. There was talk in the community that there may be one floor dedicated to being a half way house. This is untrue. With thousands of people in Edmonton needing affordable housing, I can appreciate why the non profit Meadowcroft Society is building the additional units in our area.

**The Alberta St. George of England Society** that shares our hall, has been a **great asset to our community**. Not only has their rent assisted us in paying for our utilities, but because we are not sinking all our casino money into the hall, we are able to earmark it for our new playground. I have noticed that there has been **very little vandalism** to our hall and the police have noticed that there are **fewer drug deals** going on in our parking lot since they took up residence with us. This is perhaps due to the many times they use our hall, giving it added security. Currently they are preparing their annual Pantomime called Cinderelder which will take place in our hall in early January. I encourage you to come to the play--it is a blast!
